This is an ongoing problem being caused by inconsiderate dog owners who will be prosecuted if caught. Cllr Mrs Taylor advised that other towns in the region were moving towards more formal action and in some cases had established Public Space Protection Orders thus raising the profile of the problem and giving more powers to the police to act. Through extensive debate it was concluded that Great Ayton Parish Council should seek further information regarding Public Space Protection Orders with a view to implementing the same. <b>ongoing</b></p> <p><b>Village notice board</b><br/>A query had been received via Cllr Readman as to why the Agenda/Reports/Minutes were no longer being affixed in paper form to the PC notice board. The Clerk advised that the notice board was too small to display all items and that these documents were available via the PC website as a requirement. The Clerk was asked to display Parish Council details on the noticeboard which should also give details of the web location, additionally it was agreed that copies of these items are also available via the library (GADC). <b>noted</b></p> <p><b>Councillor Robinson</b> was pleased to report that Arriva had eventually responded to requests to update their bus timetables and these were now being properly displayed at the main bus stop. The clerk was asked to write to Arriva by way of thanks. <b>ongoing</b></p> <p><b>Councillor Mrs Taylor / Councillor Robinson</b> were pleased to confirm that the BUGA volunteers had spent considerable time and effort to clean up the village hall for which all councillors expressed their thanks. The clerk was asked to organise removal of garden debris from the Cook Memorial Garden so that outdoor work could re-commence once the weather improved. <b>noted</b></p> |

**Between the dates of 4<sup>th</sup> December and 8<sup>th</sup> January 2018 the following incidents have been reported to Police;**

**Anti-Social Behaviour:**
